The Washington State Board of Education (SBE), the Educational Opportunity Gap Oversight and Accountability Committee (EGOAC), and the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) developed a new recognition framework that incorporates state level and local information to identify schools that are exemplars in terms of growth and achievement. This new recognition framework identifies schools along the entire continuum of support.
